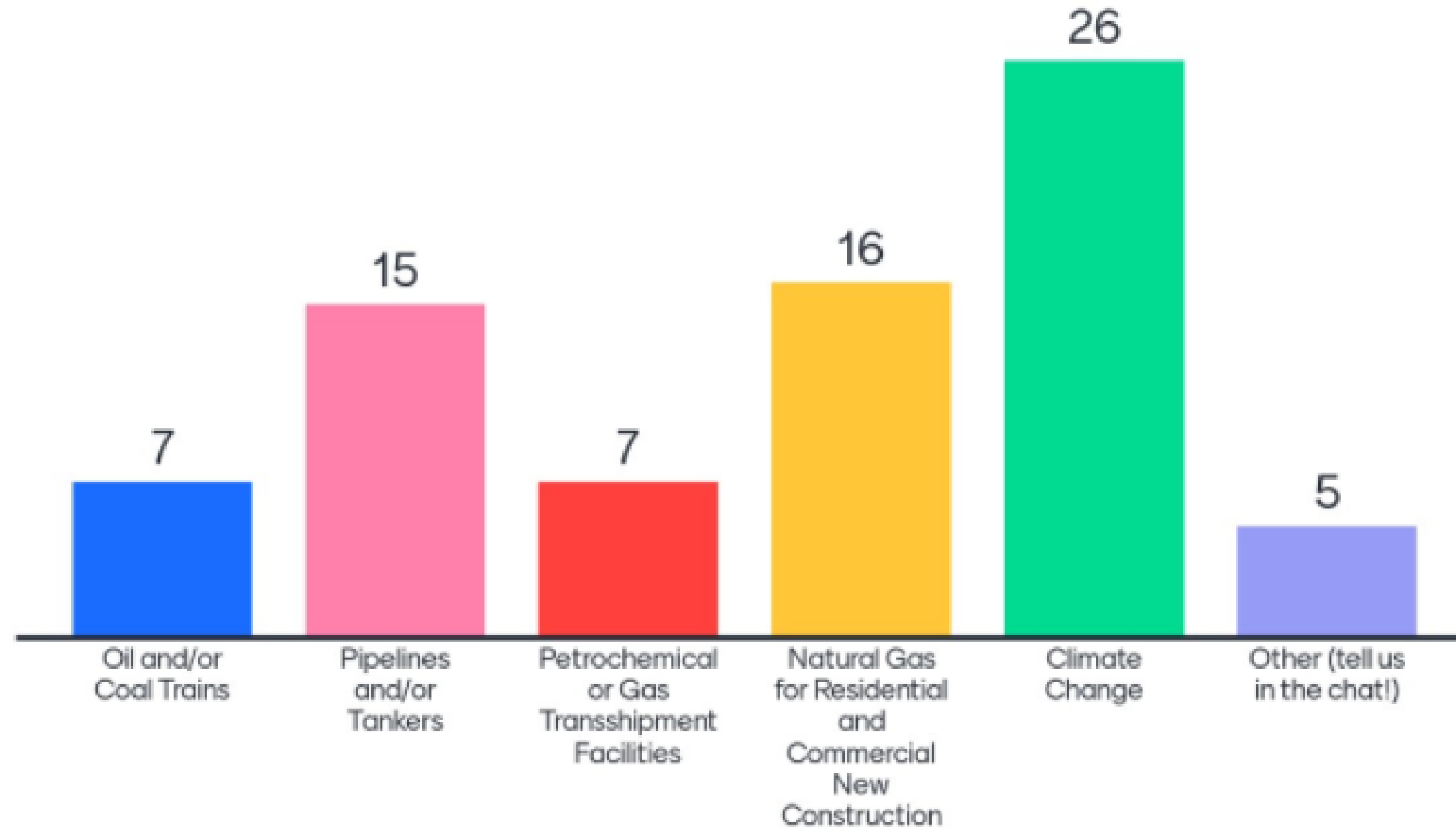


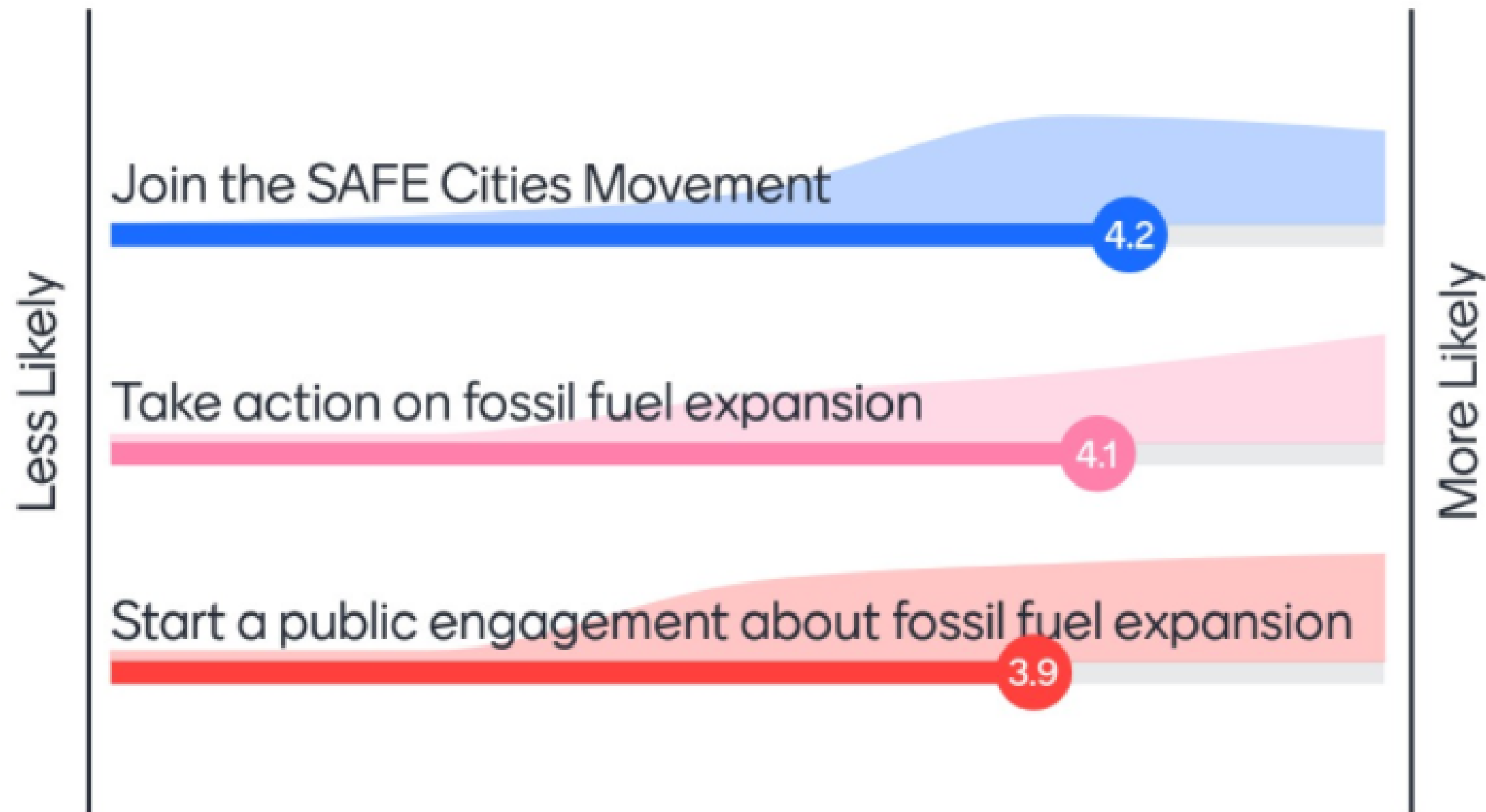


Climate SAFE Cities:
